The outcome of academic learning of the program and course offered by the institute mainly depends on Programme outcomes (POs) and Course outcomes (COs) as to correspond to the goals of each program in addition to its vision, mission and quality policy. Every Programme has clearly defined learning outcomes of its programme called Programme Outcomes (POs). The Program Outcomes are designed to identify different aspects of students learning skills like Knowledge, Cognitive skills, Analytical skills, Modern tools and instruments usage, Professional skills, Social Skills, and the development of an attitude toward lifelong learning. The POs are derived from respective Graduate Attributes (GA).

The competencies that a graduate of a program should have acquired are called Graduate Attributes. Course Outcomes are central to our course curriculum. They articulate to students, faculty, and other stakeholders what the students will achieve in each course and how their learning will be measured. A Course Outcome (CO) is a measurable, observable, and specific statement that clearly indicates what a student should know and be able to do as a result of learning. Course Outcomes framed in our institution mainly involve an action verb, subject content and level of achievement. An action verb is selected based on Bloom's taxonomy. As per the Dr.B.A.T University syllabus, we have drafted 5 COs for B. Pharmacy.

- POs & COs are circulated to all stakeholders regularly.

To make the teaching-learning process effective, the assessment of students is done in the backdrop of these and allows the faculty to focus on the attainment of these.
